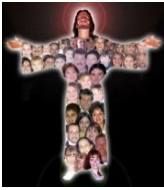
**PLAN AHEAD:**

### Hoy es el primer domingo de Adviento.

El Adviento es el comienzo del Año Litúrgico, empieza el domingo más próximo al 30 de noviembre y termina el 24 de diciembre. Son los cuatro domingos anteriores a la Navidad y forma una unidad con la Navidad y la Epifanía. El término "Adviento" viene del latín *adventus*, que significa venida, llegada. El color usado en la liturgia de la Iglesia durante este tiempo es el morado. Con el Adviento comienza un nuevo año litúrgico en la Iglesia, El sentido del Adviento es avivar en los creyentes la espera del Señor. Se puede hablar de dos partes del Adviento. Primera Parte, Desde el primer domingo al día 16 de diciembre, con marcado carácter escatológico, mirando a la venida del Señor al final de los tiempos, y Segunda Parte, Desde el 17 de diciembre al 24 de diciembre, se orienta a preparar más explícitamente la venida de Jesucristo en la historia, la Navidad.

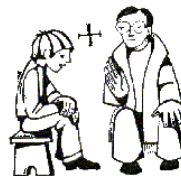

### Formation Toward Christian Ministry “FTCM” here at St. Paul’s!!!

The FTCM program seeks to develop the basic academic, spiritual and critical reflection skills necessary for Catholic adults to fully answer their Baptismal call to service. FTCM is open to all adults who seek greater understanding of their faith and is designed for those who are active in parish ministry or discerning their call to ministry.

#### Who should take FTCM?

All Catholic Adults who are:

- Seeking greater understanding of their faith
- Already engaged in ministry
- Discerning their call to church ministry

#### Program Overview and Courses

FTCM is a 108-clock hour process delivered over the course of three semesters. **Classes begin January 27, 2016 and will meet on Wednesday evenings 7 to 9 PM.** Each class session includes prayer, content presentation and group dynamics. Each semester also includes participation in a Day of Reflection as a means to integrate content into daily living. A completion ceremony, at which the Bishop presides, concludes the three-semester course of study. The 108 clock hours of FTCM consists of 90 hours of courses and 18 hours of Days of Reflection. Course content includes the study of Scripture, Doctrinal Theology, Liturgical Theology, Moral Theology, and Church History.

El costo de cada semestre es de \$75, de la siguiente manera, **el participante paga \$50 por semestre**, si la parroquia lo patrocina, el participante paga \$25, y la parroquia \$25 y la Arquidiócesis paga \$25 (financiado por DSF).

El sitio del Jardín de Paz fue bendecido con agua bendita el 05 de agosto de 1988. Fecha innovadora fue aproximadamente el 18 de septiembre de 1989. Joe Koch, Inc., compañía de un parroquiano de la iglesia de Santa Bernadette construyo el sitio. La construcción de se completó en noviembre de 1989.

La estatua de Nuestra Madre, María, fue tallada de mármol de Carrara por la Familia Padrini de Italia y fue financiada por Forest Park Memorials por \$2500. La estatua llegó a San Pablo el día de la fiesta de Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe, a las 11:00 de la mañana mientras nevaba en Houston-Clear Lake durante esa madrugada. Nevó otra vez, la semana siguiente. La nieve cubrió el sitio con mitad de una pulgada de nieve.

El jardín fue construido a mediados de enero de 1990. 14 rosales fueron plantados detrás de la estatua; uno para cada estación de la Cruz. 12 arbustos enanos color de rosa, fueron plantados a cada lado, uno para cada estrella en la corona de María.

La estatua fue bendecida el 23 de junio de 1990, la fiesta del Inmaculado Corazón de María y en la víspera de la fiesta de San Juan Bautista.

### **PEACE GARDEN HISTORY SUMMARY**

The Peace Garden was designed jointly by Rich May and members of the statue committee: Ken Bates, Mike Downey and Tom Brzustowicz. Final Architectural design was completed by Doug Calmelet with assistance from other members of the committee.

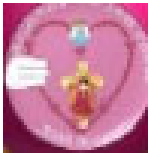
The Peace Garden site was blessed with holy water on August 5, 1988. Ground breaking date was approximately September 18, 1989. The construction was done by Joe Koch, Inc., a parishioner of St. Bernadette Church. The construction was completed in November 1989.

The statue of Mary is carved of Carrara Marble by the Padrini Family Sculptors of Italy. It was purchased through Forest Park Memorials for \$2,500. The statue arrived on the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe, December 12, 1989, at approximately 11 AM. Snowflakes fell throughout the Houston-Clear Lake area during the early morning hours of that day. It was to snow again a week later, covering the site with one half inch of snow.

The garden was constructed in mid-January 1990. There were 14 rose bushes planted behind the statue, one for each station of the cross and 12 dwarf rose bushes to each side, one for each star in Mary's crown.

The statue was blessed on June 23, 1990, on the feast of the Immaculate Heart of Mary and on the eve of the feast of St. John the Baptist.
